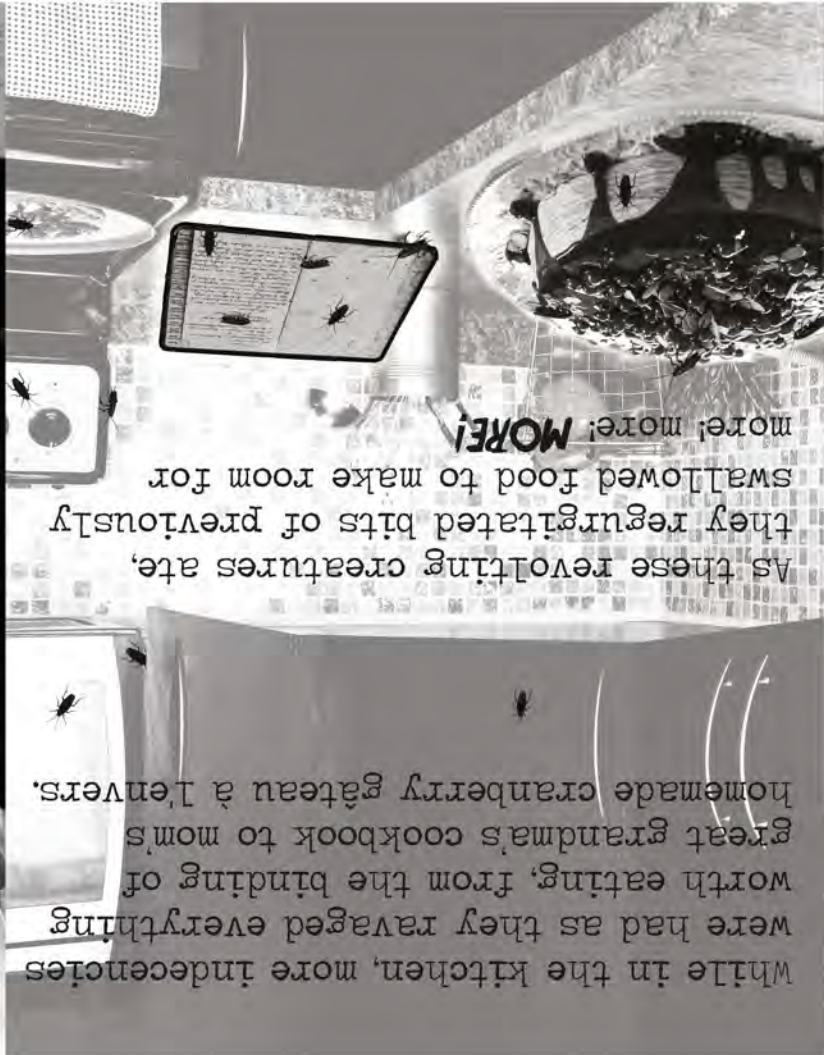




Mom comes downstairs for a sweet late-night snack to find that she's been beat!

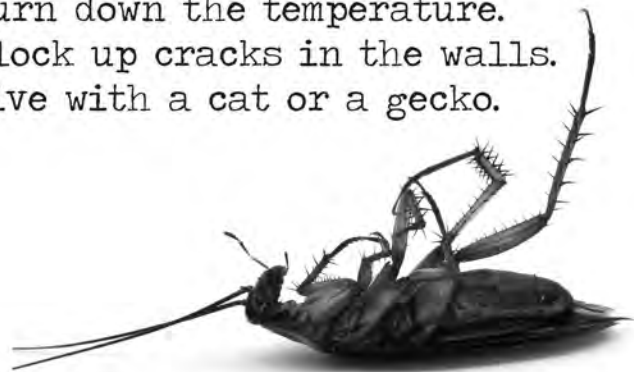


It was the **NIGHT** of May 1, 2013...

Cockroaches have existed for about 350 million years. Does that make them wiser than us?

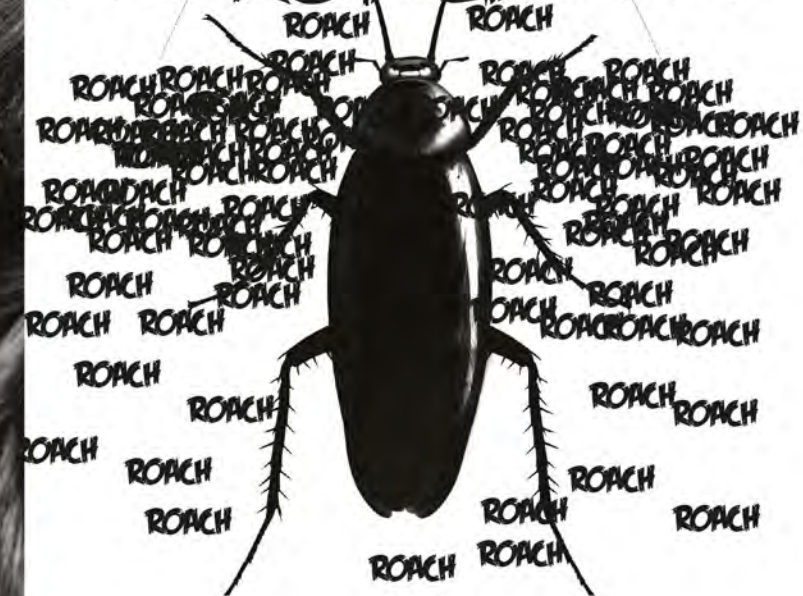
